Constitution Party of Louisiana Holds its First Electoral Convention Convention Delegates to Meet in the State Capitol, Baton Rouge, on March 15, 2008

The capitol city of Baton Rouge will host the first Electoral Convention of its state's own Constitution Party on March 15, 2008 at 2:00 pm in meeting rooms of the Hampton Inn at 4646 Constitution Avenue. Convention delegates will enact a list of duties including:

Choosing delegates to the Constitution Party National Convention being held April 23 - 26 in Kansas City, MO.

Establishing platform recommendations to be considered as the national party readies its presidential nominating convention.

Welcoming new members to the State Committee, including election of a party Sergeant-at-Arms/Parliamentarian and a state Communications Officer.

Presentations by distinguished Guests and Members:

Thomas Cryer, the man who beat the IRS in open court and who is Chief Executive of TruthAttack.org, will make a presentation regarding income tax issues and their relevance to funding government in a free society. Mr. Cryer, a successful member of the Louisiana Bar, was acquitted this past summer before a jury of his peers in Shreveport, and has emerged as a leading advocate of fair and honest tax policy.

Andrew Axsom, Louisiana's own Field Director for the Ron Paul Presidential campaign, will address functional parallels between the political philosophy of Dr. Paul and that of the Constitution Party as manifest in our current platform.

Peter Vidrine, Constitution Party candidate for U.S. Congress in District 7, will speak and request our endorsement and support in his upcoming campaign.

Remarks follow from several former state legislators and prospective constitutionalist candidates.

The Constitution Party is the third largest political party in terms of voter registration. There are 367,000 registered Constitution Party voters. In 2008, the Party expects to have ballot access in all 50 states.
